### First steps: immigration

Immigration formalities are not my area of expertise, but I recommend the following wesites that might help you better understand French Visas and the Visa application process. It's important to get a head start on this at the visa application proceess is lenghtly and detailed.

Be aware that some relocation agencies will offer help attaining your visa, but they are not always up to date on current visa requirements.

Better to seek out someone who is knowledgable in French visas and/ or contract an immigration attorney.

### First steps: Learn some French

Living in Paris without speaking French is possible, but life won't be easy every day. Paris is a cosmopolitan city, while more and more French people speak the language of Shakespeare, it's still far from the majority, especially in public services. Once you move away from the tourist areas, it can be difficult to make yourself understood if you don't have some knowledge of the French language.

### Housing in Paris

The rental market in Paris has always been very tight because supply always has exceeded demand, but this year it's gone up a notch in difficulty!

Some estate agents have told me that they have only 50% of the usual inventory. Hopefully, this situation will be temporary.

#### How to prepare for your home search

- Calculate your budget: your rent can't exceed 1/3 of your income
- Check the market and start research the current rental market on site like: SeLoger
- Exploration trip: if possible, plan a trip to Paris and stay in different neighborhoods to find the one you like best.
- Prepare your apartment file.

### Housing in Paris

Tips to enhance your chances of obtaining an apartment

- Focused on both furnished and unfurnished apartments
- Attain a private guarantor like Garantme/smartgarant or a pysical guarant it must be a French tax resident that income are 3 times the amount of your rent
- Have your application file up to date and ready to send off and don't hesitate to use storytelling to reassure the landlord that you will be able to pay your rent
- Tell your network about your housing search

### Opening a French bank account

Eventually, opening a French bank account will become essential.

And if you are an American citizen, opening a bank account can be very complicated.

The first difficulty is to open a bank account, you need an address in Paris. Some bank branches might accept the address of your hotel or Airbnb.

Secondly, many bank branches simply refuse to open a bank account for American citizen due to overly restrictive administrative procedures.

In this case, opening an account through an online Neobank, before or when you first arrive in France is a good short-term solution untill you get your apartment.

I recommend wise, a Belgian IBAN, which you can use in virtually all establishments, with a few exceptions (Internet operators).


